At Mass yesterday the Church prayed that we may be shown to be children of light' and tomorrow she will asked God to 'cast light on the darkness of our hearts'. Light is mportant in the liturgy of Advent. We pray that we may 'shine like bright torches' and hasten, 'alert, and with lighted lamps' to greet Our Lord when he comes. Thus we remember Our Lord's parable about the wise virgins whose lamps were ready for the coming of the Bridegroom. Nearer to Christmas, we shall recall how Mary was 'filled with the light of the Holy Spirit' as she 'became the dwelling-place of divinity'. All this prepares us for the Christmas liturgy, which speaks of Christ as 'the light that enlightens everyone who comes into the world'. The true light of Christmas will shine, not on our Christmas trees, but in our hearts. During Advent we get ready for that.
