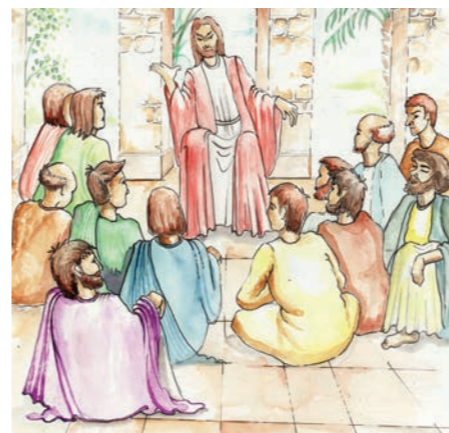

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Too often our lives are ruled by fear
or, more often by worries. Of
course it is normal when faced with
difficult or painful situations that

we worry or feel afraid of what lies
ahead for us, but Jesus wants to
assure us that he has everything in
hand. It is also natural that we want
to do something to make things
better or to prevent a difficult
situation from becoming worse. But
very often we understand that can
do very little or nothing to make
things better. These are often
moments when our faith is
seriously tested. Why does God
allow this to happen? Why doesn't
he intervene in this situation? In
today's Gospel Jesus reassures us

that he has everything in his hands
and that we should not worry, but
entrust it to him. We need to
develop the habit of working in
'tandem' with the Lord. In other
words, I do what I can in a given
situation and then entrust it to him.
And every time I start to feel
worried, I must offer it to him again,
in the certain knowledge that he
will look after that person, that
family member, that friend who is
suffering. God is our Father and he
loves those who are dear to us
infinitely more than we do.

Holiness for Everyone*

Inner and Outer Humility

To receive the gifts God wants to give us our hearts must be emptied of all
vainglory. Christ and his Mother are the greatest exemplars of humility. It is a
virtue more prized by God than all the others. Some people are proud because
of the number of expensive possessions they have, or because of their physical
beauty or superior education. ... They tell us nothing about the worth of the
person at all.

The same goes for how we look or the talents we are endowed with. It is mistake
to seek after and overvalue such things. They are no indication of the goodness
or otherwise of the person concerned. Material possessions are not wrong in
themselves, but to think that our worth depends on them is to be gravely
mistaken.

Real humility is interior. It does not mean denigrating ourselves, but thanking
God for what we have been given and appreciating God's goodness and mercy
towards us who so often fail - It is amusing to see people putting themselves
down in conversation, then becoming furious if others agree that they are less
than perfect!

Live truthfully, valuing yourself and your gifts, but not overvaluing them as if you
were responsible for your own goodness. Embrace difficulties with a humble
heart and they will soon taste sweeter than honey.
