

## No to the inequality which spawns violence

59 (cont'd) Just as goodness tends to spread, the toleration of evil, which is injustice, tends to expand its baneful influence and guietly to undermine any political and social system, no matter how solid it may appear. If every action has its consequences, an evil embedded in the structures of a society has a constant potential for disintegration and death. It is evil crystallized in unjust social structures, which cannot be the basis of hope for a better future. We are far from the so-called "end of history", since the conditions for a sustainable and peaceful development have not yet been adequately articulated and realized.

## The Sacrament of the Present Moment

God's will is the heavenly bread that nourishes the angels. It is the sacrament of the present moment life's NOW.

And where can we find this treasure? It is there for us everywhere and always because the present moment is always with us.

Holiness is not something strange, difficult to find or far


Holiness is in the here and now of our own life. No one needs directors, methods, rules if they follow this path.

## Fr Rory Writes:

There is a constant appeal, a call upon your generosity and I know it does lend itself to a sense of fatigue. "Do they want anything else but our money?" In the times that we live in, there is no escape because there are so many needs made clear to us. In a way it is a compliment to our approach to life, that we are concerned, that we can be called upon. Please God, as best we can, and with as much wisdom and generosity we should continue to respond.

Last year the Leaven Group and Finance Committee from St George's community came up with a suggestion to donate to charities. I thought it was a good one, because of God's providence, and considering the income from the hall and presbytery, we were then in a financial position to respond. There are so many worthwhile needs and they made a generous decision. We are a parish made up of two communities and another generous response has recently been made to the appeal for "Love In A Box" - 46 Boxes have been filled! I think a contribution of £150 should be made from the parish funds towards the costs entailed in transporting the boxes to their destination in Eastern Europe.

A BIG thank you to all who have packed shoe boxes or given contributions to put in the boxes for Love in a Box this year. We have been delighted with the response to our appeal and I am sure the children who receive them in Moldova will be so happy with your generosity. Many of the children in schools, orphanages and hospitals will be so happy that people in England care enough to give so generously. So many thanks to all who contributed to the boxes. The number of shoe boxes we have received from the two parishes is 46. This is a magnificent number and the Mustard Seed organisation will be very delighted to have them.

St Anne's Day Centre for the Homeless: During November we collect items for St Anne's Centre in Brighton for the homeless and there is a box at the rear of the church for contributions (until the end of the month). This year they particularly require men's underpants (medium size) and tee shirts. Also requested are toiletries (those samples from holidays are welcome) toothpaste and brushes, shampoo, shower gel, soap, flannels, deodorant. They also need coffee, tea, washing up liquid and are happy to have stores' own brands of these or refill packs. The ONLY clothing they require are hats, scarves, gloves and socks. They are unable to accept any other outdoor clothing as they have lost storage space in the premises they use.
