Our Faith on Sunday

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Today's Gospel speaks of the Father and the Son but, strangely, on the feast of the Holy Trinity, there is no mention of the Spirit. However, it is

clear from last week's Gospel that the Holy Spirit has a crucial role to play in the life of believers. What is also clear, especially in John's Gospel, is that there is an unbreakable bond of love between the Father and the Son. The fruit of this bond of love is the Holy Spirit. Jesus tells us that the way to the Father is through the Son, that is, through him. We can know and love the Father through loving his son. And the most immediate way of loving Jesus is by loving our brothers and sisters, whoever they may be, members of my family, work colleagues, the beggar on the street. Unless I love especially the

least of these fellow human beings, the Father does not recognise me. And where does the third member of the Holy Trinity come into all this? In loving the Father, through the Son, I receive the precious gift of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit then strengthens me to be able to love my brothers and sisters even more. If we enter into this relationship with the Father through the Son and thus receive the gift of the Spirit, then, in a certain way we also participate in the life of the Trinity, which is a no less than a cycle of perfect love.

II. TEMPATIONS FACED BY PASTORAL WORKERS

No to selfishness and spiritual sloth

82. The problem is not always an excess of activity, but rather activity undertaken badly, without adequate motivation, without a spirituality which would permeate it and make it pleasurable. As a result, work becomes more tiring than necessary, even leading at times to illness. Far from a content and happy tiredness, this is a tense, burdensome, dissatisfying and, in the end, unbearable fatigue. This pastoral acedia can be caused by a number of things. Some fall into it because they throw themselves into unrealistic projects and are not satisfied simply to do what they reasonably can. Others, because they lack the patience to allow processes to mature; they want everything to fall from

Choosing Virtues

When love enters our hearts it always comes with other virtues in attendance, ... Virtues need to be exercised at appropriate times and in appropriate ways. The time of mourning and the time of gladness demand different responses. We may not have many occasions to exercise fortitude, great heartedness and munificence in giving; but meekness/ temperance, modesty and humility are qualities which are always in season.

Along with the above we should practice the virtues that most accord with the kind of life we are called to live. Look at the lives of the saints and you will see the different ways they found to live out their Christian calling: some through mercy to the poor, others through penance, others through preaching or welcoming pilgrims.

Focus on your gifts and strong points rather than on your weaknesses and failures. That way you will make progress in the spiritual life, for one virtue practised perfectly brings others along with it.

It is a mistake to aim for perfection in such a way that harshness and severity predominate. Go gently and take advice from others. Growth is always gradual.

Concentrate on the virtues Jesus shows in his own life: patience, gentleness, obedience, poverty and so forth.

Better to be a good human being than a bad angel!
