A STRANGER ON THE ROAD

80. Jesus told the parable of the Good Samaritan in answer to the question: Who is my neighbour? The word "neighbour", in the society of Jesus' time, usually meant those nearest us. It was felt that help should be given primarily to those of one's own group and race. For some Jews of that time, Samaritans were looked down upon, considered impure. They were not among those to be helped. Jesus, himself a Jew, completely transforms this approach. He asks us not to decide who is close enough to be our neighbour, but rather that we ourselves become neighbours to all.

Lord, teach me how to grow old!

Convince me that the community does me no wrong if it lifts responsibilities from my back, no longer asks my advice, and finds others to take my place.

Take from me the pride of experience and the sense of my indispensability. May I be able to accept, in this gradual detachment from things, what is simply the law of time; and may I be able to see in this change in my duties one of the most fascinating manifestations of life renewed by your Providence.

Keep me, O Lord, useful to the world, contributing by my optimism and my prayers to the joy and the courage of those who are now in the harness of responsibility; and make me humble and serene in my contact with the changing world, having no regrets for the past, offering my sufferings as a gift for the reconciliation of society. May my leaving the field of action be simple and natural, like the gentle setting of the sun.

Forgive me if only today, in tranquillity, I under stand how much you have loved me and helped me. At least in this moment may I have a clear and full perception of the destiny of incredible joy you have prepared for me, and towards which you have set me walking since the very first day of my life.

Lord, teach me how to grow old like this! Amen.



Fr Rory Writes:

We have celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Now let us continue to prepare for the celebration Mass here in Hailsham for our Centenary of celebrating.
