So we must be of humble mind, dear brothers and sisters, and shed anything that smacks of arrogance, conceit, stupidity or rage. We must practise what is written, for the Holy Spirit says: 'Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom, nor the strong man of his strength, nor the rich man of his riches, but if anyone would boast, let his boast be in the Lord, as he seeks him out and performs acts of justice and righteousness'.

We should bear in mind especially the words of the Lord Jesus, which he spoke when he was teaching gentleness and patient endurance. This was his message: 'Be merciful and you will obtain mercy. Forgive and you will be forgiven. As you do to others, so it will be done to you. As you give, so will you be given to. As you judge, so will you be judged. As you are kind, so will kindness be shown to you. The measure you give will be the measure you get'.

With this commandment and these directives to guide us, let us resolve to walk in obedience to his sacred words and in humility of spirit. For, as the divine Word reminds us: 'On whom shall I look, but on the meek, the quiet, the one who trembles at my word?'
