GOSPEL REFLECTION



Wars, earthquakes, plagues and famines are predicted by Jesus in today's Gospel. It is almost as if he is describing what we are experiencing in our 21st century world. Christians are

also experiencing persecution and death in many parts of the world. The way things seem to be going with global warming we might well wonder if this world is coming to an end. In this very 'apocalyptic'

Gospel we need to understand what exactly Jesus is trying to tell us. Above all, he is telling us that if we persevere in loving God and our neighbour, in spite of all the difficulties our

world is facing we will come to no harm. Clearly, we may suffer physical harm and even death, but Jesus promises us that our "endurance will win you your lives." The lives we will win are not our earthly lives, but our lives beyond the grave, when we will be rewarded for remaining faithful in the face of injustice, violence and even death.

102. What would be the reaction to that same story nowadays, in a world that constantly witnesses the emergence and growth of social groups clinging to an identity that separates them from others? How would it affect those who organize themselves in a way that prevents any foreign presence that might threaten their identity and their closed and self-referential structures? There, even the possibility of acting as a neighbour is excluded; one is a neighbour only to those who serve their purpose. The word "neighbour" loses all meaning; there can only be "associates", partners in the pursuit of particular interests.80
