140. Life without fraternal gratuitousness becomes a form of frenetic commerce, in which we are constantly weighing up what we give and what we get back in return. Consequently, all of us are able to give without expecting anything in return, to do good to others without demanding that they treat us well in return. As Jesus told his disciples: "Without cost you have received, without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8).

And we should not be foolishly irritated and annoved when someone corrects us and tries to tum us from the wrong to the right path. We sometimes do things that are wrong without being aware of it. Let us then put our righteousness into practice, so that in the end we may be saved. Those who obey these instructions are blessed. Though they suffer for a short while in this world, they shall gain the immortal fruit of the resurrection. So the devout should not grieve if, for the time being, they seem to have much to endure, for a time of blessedness awaits them. That soul will live again on high with those who have gone before, and its rejoicing will extend to an eternity free of sorrow.

We must not be troubled by the fact that we see bad people enjoying great riches, while God's servants are reduced to the bare necessities. Brothers and sisters, we must have faith.
