Our Faith on Sunday

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Last Sunday's Gospel is a warning about judging how God chooses to reward through his mercy and forgiveness. Today's Gospel warns us about categorizing people into good and bad, acceptable or unacceptable, moral or immoral. If God does not judge them, then how can we dare to do so? Jesus, much to the disgust of the chief priests and the elders, the Scribes and the Pharisees – the respectable members of Jewish society – frequently

associates with disreputable people. And why? Because, unlike us, Jesus does not judge by outward appearances, but sees into the soul of each person. He sees in the prostitutes and the tax collectors, the lowest of the low in most people's opinion, a depth and a beauty which 'respectable' people cannot see. And because he sees their inner beauty they feel loved and not judged, and therefore they feel free to respond to his love.

It is too easy for to make superficial judgments of others. Even the way someone dresses, or has their hair, can lead us to judge their character. Jesus sincerely believed that everyone was a candidate for the kingdom of heaven and he treated them as potential residents of that kingdom. He made the effort to go

149. But I urge you not to do anything in a spirit of divisiveness, but only according to the teaching of Christ. For I heard certain persons saying: 'If I do not find it in the original documents of the Old Testament, then I do not believe it'. And when I told them that it is indeed in scripture, they answered: 'That is what we dispute'.

For me, however, the original documents are Jesus Christ, the sacred original documents are his cross, his death, his resurrection and the faith we have through him, and it is in these that I desire to be justified by your prayers.
