Mark 4:26-34

Night and day, while he sleeps. when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.



GOSPEL REFLECTION



Sometimes when we look at the shortage of priests and shrinking

mass attendances we easily become discouraged. The future does not look great. However, today's Gospel may give us some consolation. Every individual Christian and every parish community, if they try sincerely to live the Gospel and love their understand that most of the neighbours are like the seeds thrown on to the land. The seeds are not aware of what is happening, in fact they spend much of their existence in the dark, underground. Eventually the plant grows, and when the time is ripe, they are harvested. This process describes the experience that many of us are

going through today in the Church. Like the seed in the parable, when we live the Gospel, we sprout and grow without realising it. Of course we have to guard against complacency, but we have to work is done by God. Our part is to follow his will.

EFFECTIVE LOVE

184. Charity is at the heart of every healthy and open society, yet today "it is easily dismissed as irrelevant for interpreting and giving direction to moral responsibility". 175 Charity, when accompanied by a commitment to the truth, is much more than personal feeling, and consequently need not "fall prey to contingent subjective emotions and opinions". 176 Indeed its close relation to truth fosters its universality and preserves it from being "confined to a narrow field devoid of relationships". 177 Otherwise, it would be "excluded from the plans and processes of promoting human development of universal range, in dialogue between knowledge and praxis". 178 Without truth, emotion lacks relational and social content. Charity's openness to truth thus protects it from "a fideism that deprives it of its human and universal breadth". 179

Lovers of the Godhead, whose whole being is shot through with love for the unseen beauty, rejoice in the deep recesses of their soul. They are gladdened by the most delightful fire, for they have given themselves to God with utter devotion. And so, when the time is right, and not necessarily when we think we deserve it, we will receive into our hearts a sound sent from heaven. Then meditation will turn into melody and the mind dwell in marvellous harmony.

At this point, we have received angelic sweetness in our soul, such as the praises sung by the angels in heaven. Sweetness and song are linked when they are experienced. In this case it is the tune that makes the song, not any words that are chanted. We can sing praises then in heavenly sweetness, not wanting to mix with other singers but desiring to be alone, led by the Holy Spirit. The cry of love that is expressed in this kind of song is a craving for Christ. Our inner being is consumed with love. Our heart is alight and burning. We do not engage in any outward work except work that can be turned to good. We praise God in song but the song is silent to human ears and is heard only in the heart of God.


