GOSPEL REFLECTION



Today's Gospel recounts Jesus' being tempted by the devil. It seems very strange to us that Jesus was tempted, but it was a part of his 'human' experience. In itself, temptation is not a sin, it only becomes such when we give in to it. The affluent

consumer society in which we live assails us with temptations of every type. Often we succumb to temptation when we let ourselves be convinced that we really need a new smart phone, a new car, a new house and that these possessions will increase our happiness. The advertising companies are expert at creating desires, or rather, of making us confuse desire with need. The


pornographers promise us sexual nirvana, the drug pedlars promise ecstasy, but the facts tell us that the results are completely the opposite. It is not very fashionable nowadays to speak about the devil, but he is present just as much today as he was at the time of Jesus. If we act as if he didn't exist, we will fall very easily into his trap.

RECOVERING KINDNESS

222. Consumerist individualism has led to great injustice. Other persons come to be viewed simply as obstacles to our own serene existence; we end up treating them as annoyances and we become increasingly aggressive. This is even more the case in times of crisis, catastrophe and hardship, when we are tempted to think in terms of the old saying, "every man for himself". Yet even then, we can choose to cultivate kindness. Those who do so become stars shining in the midst of darkness.



Here I would also like to mention the situation of families living in dire poverty and great limitations. The problems faced by poor households are often all the more trying.36 For example, if a single mother has to raise a child by herself and needs to leave the child alone at home while she goes to work, the child can grow up exposed to all kind of risks and obstacles to personal growth. In such difficult situations of need, the Church must be particularly concerned to offer understanding, comfort and acceptance, rather than imposing straightaway a set of rules that only lead people to feel judged and abandoned by the very Mother called to show them God's mercy. Rather than offering the healing power of grace and the light of the Gospel message, some would "indoctrinate" that message, turning it into "dead stones to be hurled at others".

Parish Pastoral Plan Update

The Parish Pastoral Plan was launched over a year ago, with plans for our new parish, "Eastbourne and St Leonards," set to begin in November 2024, led by our parish Moderator, Father Kevin Dring from OLR.

In January, Father Kevin introduced a Parish Development Plan outlining the goals for the next six months. A Parish Leadership Group, including clergy and lay members, was formed and began meeting in February. For administrative purposes, the new parish will be split into two leadership hubs: Eastbourne (seven churches, including St George & St Wilfrid's) and St Leonards (eight churches from Battle to Rye). At this level we looked at developing the goals up to June. This is a long-term process, and all parishioners are encouraged to contribute. Father Kevin opened last week's PLG meeting with a reading from Ephesians: "Out of his infinite glory, may he give you the power through his Spirit for your hidden self to grow strong." Let's all grow strong together to make this plan a success.
